Beacon is a Leeds wide service that provides supported accommodation for individuals and families who are homeless and have complex needs. This includes issues around mental health, offending, substance misuse and safeguarding. The accommodation provision is a mixture of intensive accommodation, with access to staff 24-hours a day, seven days a week and dispersed properties with visiting support. Intensive accommodation is generally provided in a shared environment and the dispersed accommodation is a combination of shared and self-contained flats. Both the support and accommodation is temporary (generally up to 6 months), the aim of which is to provide stability, promote independence and re-settle clients into the community.

Tenancy training and peer support is also offered as part of the Beacon service.

Eligibility criteria

- Be over 16 years old and have an established local connection to Leeds i.e. Leeds resident, family associations, previous or current employment etc.
- Be willing to participate in the Beacon support planning process and possess sufficient living skills to be able to maintain a tenancy with the support provided
- Require a period of supported accommodation to live independently, addressing complex and multiple needs*
and/or
- Require accommodation for safeguarding purposes
- Have limited accommodation options available, for example being unsuitable to access Private Rented Sector accommodation or the Council Lettings Scheme due to high support or risk issues
and/or
- Require accommodation due to leaving institutions such as prison, hospital etc
- Not present a level of risk that would significantly compromise the safety of staff and others working or living within close proximity of the client.
